Met for conference. Brethren and sisters had a comfortable session in relating the dealings of God to their souls. Brother Oliver Hinkley offered himself for baptism. Sister Elizabeth Wilbur requested to join this conference.

Brother Enock Hunkton and his wife came forward for baptism. The brethren thought it proper and appointed a church meeting on Saturday next at one o'clock at the schoolhouse.

6 Voted to receive Sister Elizabeth Hinkley a member

7 Voted to receive Ebenezer Hinkley into full fellowship

8 Voted that we consider Mr. Enock Hunkton and Lovanna his wife fit subjects for baptism

9 Voted to receive Sister Elizabeth Wilbur into full fellowship

Voted that this meeting be dissolved

Concluded by prayer and giving thanks

April 24th 1831

Met for church meeting as a branch of the Methodist church

1 Voted to receive Sister Hannah Sargent as a fit subject for the ordinance of baptism

On conferring together it was thought most proper not to receive Mr. John Sargent as a subject for baptism who had previously offered himself.

2. Voted to send a Committee of three to visit him
 3. Chose Brethren Samuel Stowers, Henry Wilbur and John Sargent Committee to visit B. B. Parson. On conferring together in regard to reporting things above which are transacted in the Church, the Brethren and sisters covenanted together anew to observe Scripture Rules agreeably to the Faith of our Connection.
 4. Chose Brethren Abel Cook, Samuel Stowers and Hanson Cook to visit Mr. Oliver Hinkley.
 5. Voted that the last chosen Committee visit Oliver Hinkley's wife.
