Agreed that Brother Marrow still have a standing with the Brethren provided he manifest by his conduct that he is determined to serve the Lord

Agreed to accept the report which is unfavorable
 - 4 Brother Huntton came forward by way of confession of his wrongs and wished to stand with the Brethren
Agreed that Brother Huntton and wife still have a standing with the Brethren
 - 5 Chose Brother John Smith Deacon of this Church

(35) January 10th 1834

Met for Conference Meeting
The Brethren and Sisters appeared present relating the dealings of God to them and their exercises of mind. It may be considered a low time in the Church and conference Meetings not so full as we could wish but a good degree of Union existing
And after praying speaking and singing together parted in love

It may here be observed that though there has not been record kept of conference Meetings they have been attended every Month since the Church was Organized by more or less of the Members of this Church

Feb. 14th 1834

Held our conference Meeting as usual
Though but few in number and the Church in a low state yet we experienced a comfortable season in speaking, praying and relating the exercise of our minds and our determination to persevere in the good cause of God
